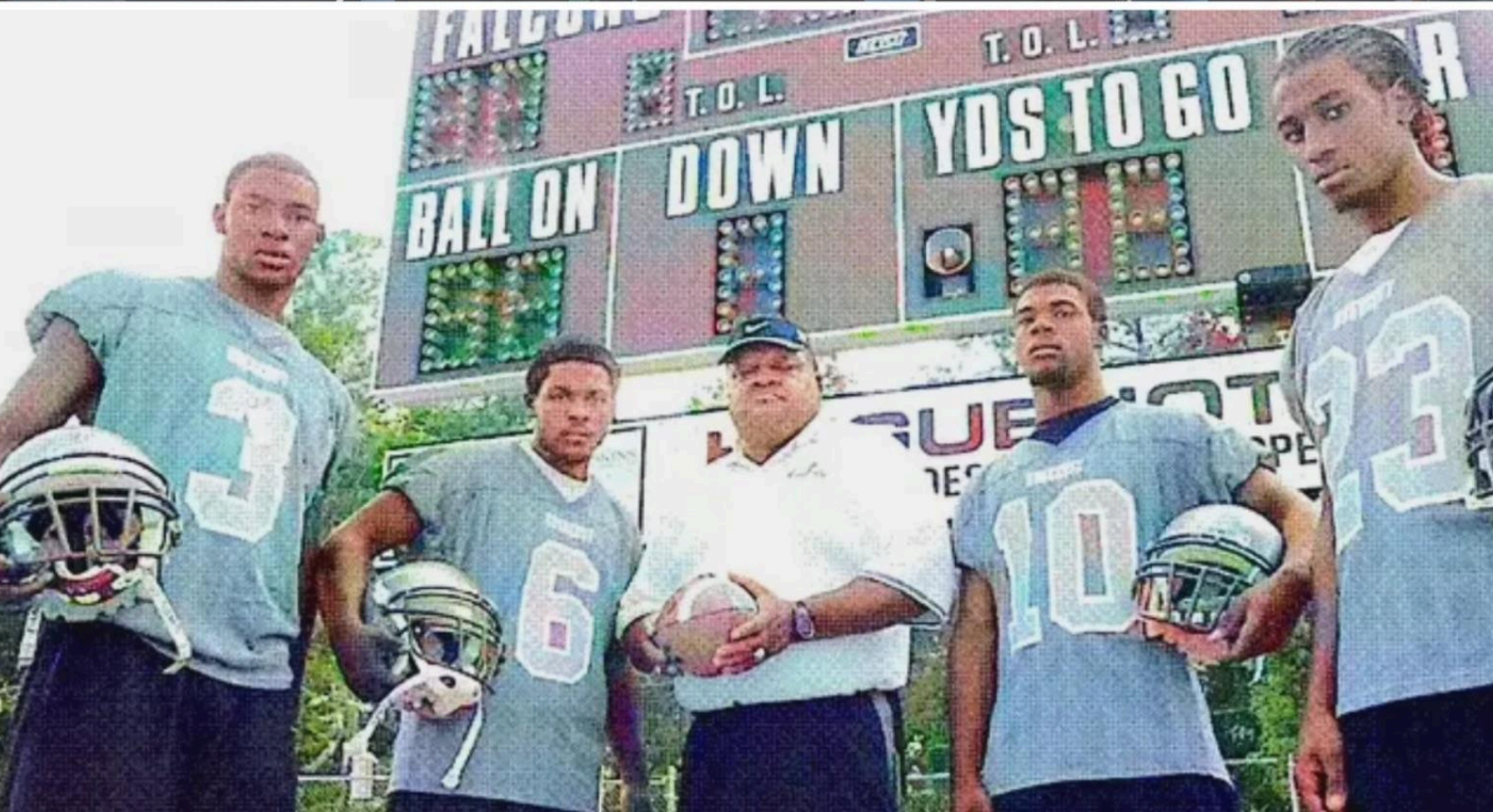

Stadium

Richard McFee Field

Huguenot High School opened in 1960 with a football field that featured no permanent bleachers. As interest in Falcons football grew, students organized magazine fundraisers in 1962 to help expand the stadium, leading to the addition of home-side bleachers in 1963. By the late 1960s, Falcons football had become a major attraction in the City of Richmond, with Homecoming games regularly drawing standing-room-only crowds of 2,000 to 3,000 fans.

From 1979 to 1986, Richmond Public Schools combined several high schools into athletic complexes, including Armstrong–Kennedy, Marshall–Walker, and Jefferson–Huguenot–Wythe. During this period, Huguenot served as the primary home field for the Jefferson–Huguenot–Wythe “Trojans,” hosting games until the schools returned to separate identities in the fall of 1986.

In the 1990s, away-side bleachers seating approximately 1,500 were added to accommodate visiting fans. For many years, the Huguenot stadium stood as the only adequate football facility available to a Richmond Public School, serving as the site of numerous high-profile matchups and raucous crowds. The original stadium hosted many memorable games, including a 48–7 victory over then-powerhouse L.C. Bird in 1994, the Falcons’ Central Region Championship win over Patrick Henry in 1998, and a collegiate matchup in which No. 4-ranked Virginia Union University was upset by Morgan State University. The away bleachers were also occasionally used by the Falcons when George Wythe was designated the home team during their annual rivalry.



In 2001, Huguenot was selected for the *Fields for Tomorrow* initiative, led primarily by the Washington Redskins under owner Dan Snyder, with Hermitage alumnus Shawn Barber playing a key supporting role. The project provided major upgrades, including a new sprinkler system, grass, scoreboard, and goalposts.

In 2007, plans were approved to rebuild Huguenot High School on the existing site. The Falcons played their final game at the original stadium on November 5, 2010, a 34–14 loss to Clover Hill, before using Richmond’s City Stadium as their home field from 2011–2014.

The new Huguenot High School opened in January 2015, and the football team returned to campus later that year. The Falcons played their first game at the current 3,500-seat stadium on August 8, 2015, earning a 14–0 victory over Thomas Jefferson.

On August 29, 2025, the stadium was officially named Richard McFee Field, honoring longtime head coach Richard McFee (1988–2007).

VHSL Classification & District History

In 2013, the Virginia High School League (VHSL) implemented a major statewide realignment of athletic classifications. The long-standing structure of Group AAA (Divisions 5 & 6), Group AA (Divisions 3 & 4), and Group A (Divisions 1 & 2) was replaced to better align school populations with competitive classifications. This change was designed to create a more balanced playing field by preventing schools with significantly smaller enrollments from competing against much larger schools. The realignment also expanded postseason access, allowing more teams to qualify for the playoffs and adding an additional round to the playoff format.

As part of the 2013 realignment, Huguenot transitioned from Group AAA Division 5 to Class 3A, competing in Region 3A East and Conference 26 during the 2013 and 2014 seasons. In 2015 and 2016, the Falcons were reclassified to Class 4A and competed in Region 4A East and Conference 20. In 2017, VHSL once again adjusted its structure, expanding to six classifications (Classes 1–6) with regions labeled A through D. Huguenot was placed in Class 4, Region B (4B), where the Falcons have remained since.

Huguenot has competed in the Dominion District since 1986, maintaining one of the most consistent district schedules in the Commonwealth. The Dominion District originally included Huguenot, Clover Hill, Midlothian, Monacan, L.C. Bird, and George Wythe (now Richmond High School for the Arts). Manchester High School was added to the Dominion District in 1992 after moving from its previous Hull Street site to the new Bailey Bridge Road site. James River High School joined the district upon its opening in 1994, followed by Cosby High School in 2006. In 2019, Powhatan High School moved into the Dominion District, completing the current alignment.

Although winning a District Championship is no longer significant for postseason qualification as it was during the Group AAA Division 5 era, Huguenot continues to play a full Dominion District schedule and recognizes District Championships as long as that schedule is maintained. District, Regional, and Playoff records listed in this section reflect competition within the appropriate VHSL classifications and formats of each era.

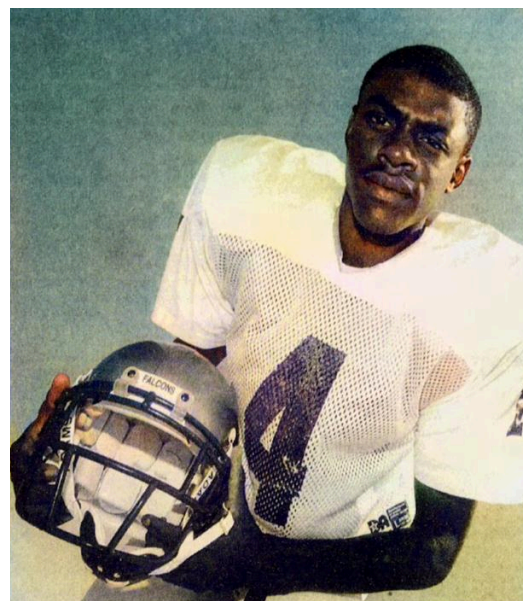

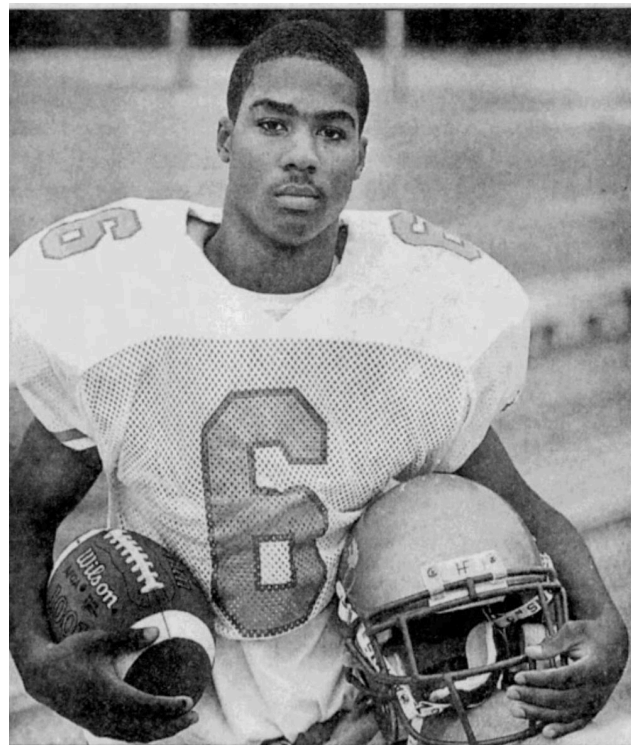

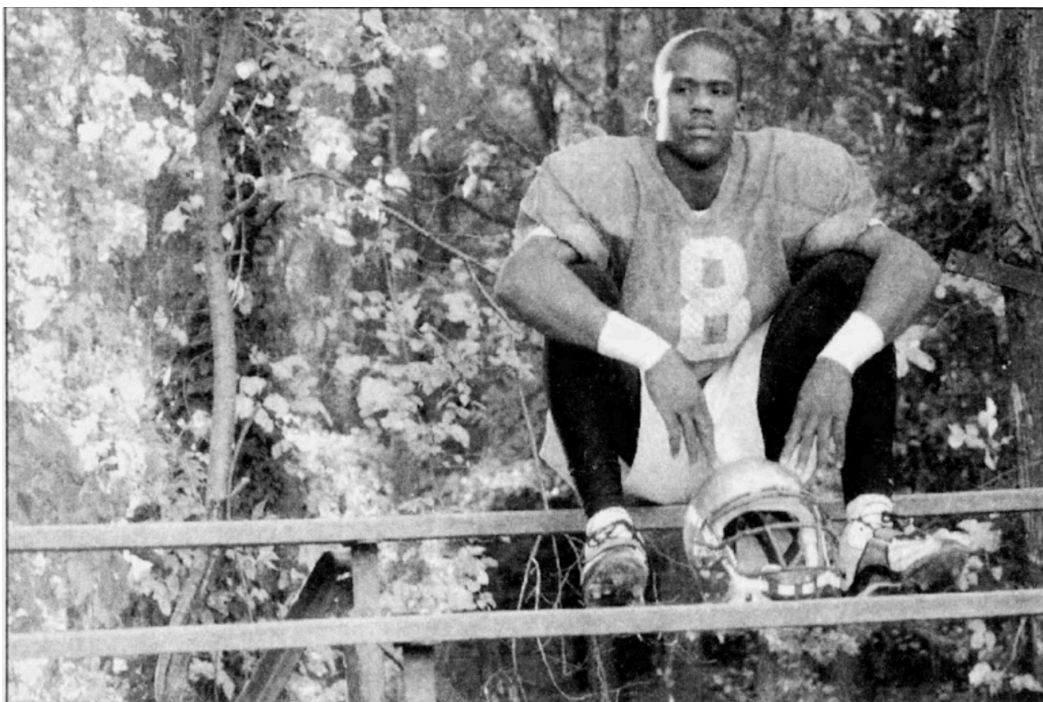

Throughout multiple VHSL classification systems and competitive eras, Huguenot players have continued to earn individual recognition at the District, Regional, Metro, and State levels. While traditional district accolades were phased out following VHSL realignment, players have remained eligible for Region, Metro, and State honors based on postseason structure and performance.

In 2023, Clarence Kenney of Noah Sports created the Maxie Awards All-City Team, which recognizes standout football players exclusively from Richmond Public Schools. This honor provides an additional platform to celebrate individual excellence within the City of Richmond and ensures continued recognition of Huguenot student-athletes despite changes in district and postseason formats.

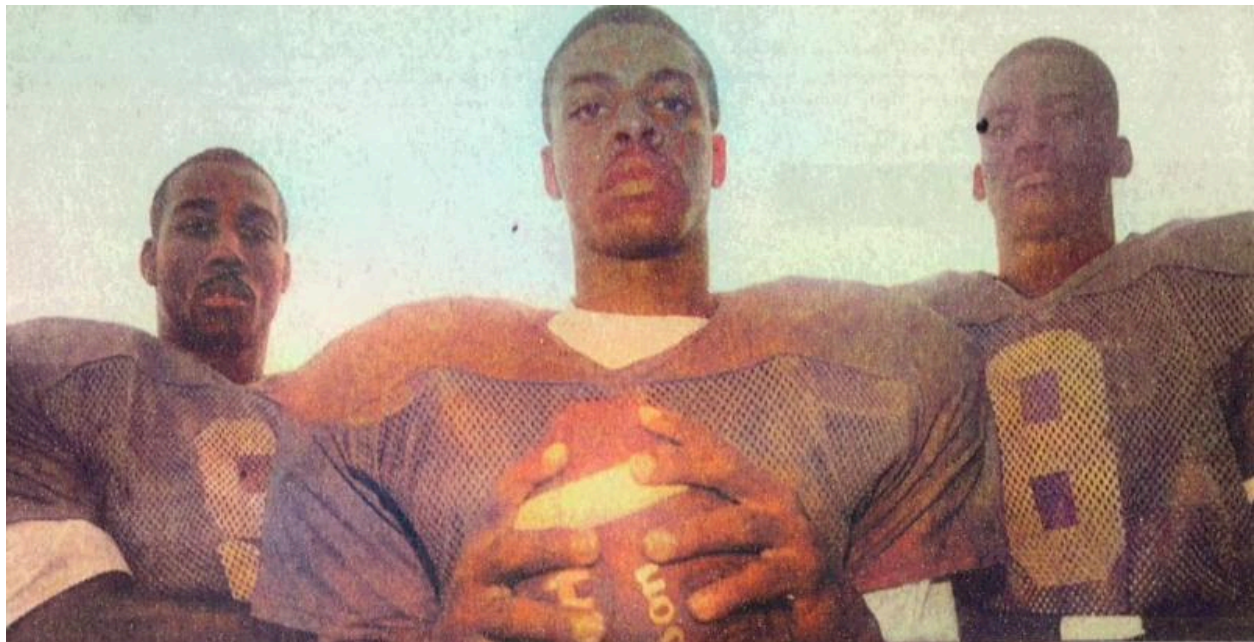
